Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby directed, to cause to be printed in two papers in the city of Baltimore, and in one paper in each county where a newspaper is printed, such acts passed by the General Assembly at its present session, as may provide for the general revenue of the State.

And be it resolved, That the said treasurer be authorized to pay for the said publication out of any unappropriated money at the ordinary rate of publishing in newspaper.
