In any suit in, where there are several defendants, suit not necessarily to abate by the death of one or more, &c. against whom decree for account, &c. shall have been passed or other proceedings had as would have warranted such decree, &c. court may order the case to be proceeded in as if no such death had occurred, &c. or require a bill of revivor, &c. provided if any heir, &c. shall appear before final decree and pray to be made a party, the court may pass an order admitting such person, &c. subject to the terms imposed, &c.

Final decree shall not abate by the suggestion of the death of any one of the parties, court in such case may order execution of such as if no death had occurred, &c.
