SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners by this act appointed or a majority of them, shall estimate the damage that may be sustained by any persons over whose lands said road may pass, and the damage so determined, shall be levied as other public charges are in said district and county, and shall be paid by the district or county respectively, in which such damages may be sustained; provided, the owners of the land over which said road Proviso. may pass shall require the same.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, before they proceed to act shall take an oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, that they will faithfully discharge the duties required of them by this act.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That this act shall not go into effect, until a majority of the commissioners of Carroll county and Howard District, shall respectively issue their order directing the opening said road.

An act for the relief of John S. Crockett, late sheriff and Passed March collector of Somerset county.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John S. Crockett, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect and receive all and any balance or amount of officers fees, chancery taxes and fines, and forfeitures and county taxes, which may be due to the said John S.
