

- CHAP. 249. *Issues forbid.* SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed as to authorize this corporation to issue any device, token, note, certificate or other evidence of debt to be used as a currency.
- Right reserved. SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That the right is hereby expressly reserved to the general assembly of Maryland at its pleasure to alter or repeal the act of incorporation.

 CHAPTER 248.

- Passed March 4, 1844. *An act to authorize the Levy Court of Frederick county to make an appropriation for the Frederick and Buckley's town Road.*
- Levy court to levy. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Levy Court of Frederick county, be, and they are hereby authorized in their discretion, to levy upon the taxable property of said county, a sum of money not exceeding four hundred dollars, for the purpose of repairing by a good and substantial wall or otherwise the road at the sand hole on the Frederick and Buckley's town road, so as to make the same free from danger.

- Passed March 4, 1844. *An act to incorporate the Howard Lyceum of Ellicott's Mills.*
- Preamble WHEREAS, it is represented to this general assembly that a number of the inhabitants of Howard District and Baltimore counties have formed themselves into a society whose object is the promotion of literature and the encouragement of the arts and sciences by providing a library, reading-rooms, and lecture rooms, and all necessary apparatus for the use of the same—Therefore,
