CHAP 306.

An act relating to the inspection of Tobacco in the city of Passed March Baltimore.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That whenever so large an amount of inspected tobacco shall have accumulated in the warehouses, as necessarily to delay the inspections, the inspectors be and they are hereby authorised and required, to remove and store out of the warehouses, so much of the same as may be necessary, to give place for the the uninspected tobacco.

Inspectors authorised to remove & store.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That on all tobacco inspected and delivered for shipment, the inspectors of the State Tobacco Warehouses, shall receive and pay into the Trea- spectors to resury one dollar and twenty-five cents per hogshead on all hogsheads not exceeding one thousand weight, and all hogsheads weighing more than one thousand weight, shall be subject to the additional charge of twelve and a half cents, on every hundred exceeding one thousand weight.

SEC. 3. Be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Appoint person to act as inspectors of the several Tobacco Warehouses to appoint the weighing some competent white person to act as weighing clerk, clerk. whose duty it shall be to weigh all tobacco and tobacco casks that may be received and inspected at the warehouse in which he shall be employed, and this duty shall be performed by no other person, under a penalty of one hundred dollars, to be paid by the inspector, unless in case of sickness, when it shall be the duty of the inspector to appoint
