Commission-

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Harford county, be and are hereby authorized, to levy a sum of money (not exceeding the sum of two hundred dollars,) on the taxable property of said county, for the purpose of building a watch-house in the town of Havre-de-Grace; provided they deem it expedient so to do.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, an act entitled, an act supplemental to an act entitled, an act to regulate the municipal government of Howard District of Anne Arundel county, passed at December session eighteen hundred and forty, chapter five, be and the same is hereby repealed.
