legates, have been appointed to execute the said resolutions; AND WHEREAS it now appears that it will take a much longer time than was anticipated—Therefore,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That said committee may postpone so much of their duty as requires to be performed at the commissioners office in the city of Baltimore, until after the termination of the present session of the legislature, and they are hereby authorized and required to perform said duty, during the recess of the legislature, and make report thereof to the Governor, to be communicated by him to the legislature at its next session.

Resolved, that the Treasurer pay the members of the committee the sum of four dollars, for each and every day in which they shall be engaged in the discharge of their duty, and two dollars for every twenty miles they shall travel by the usual route in going to and returning from Baltimore.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be, and and he is hereby directed, to furnish to the order of Capt. George Schley, of the Hagerstown Cadets fifty Knapsacks, by his giving satistory security for their safe keeping and return; provided, the same are in the armory.
