WHEREAS it is understood that an act providing for the transfer of the stock held by the United States in the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, to the State of Maryland, has passed the United States Senate, and that the same is now pending in the House of Representatives; Therefore,

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the representatives of this state in the house of representatives of the congress of the United States, be requested to give their prompt and earnest attention to the subject, and to expedite the passage of said act through said house by every means in their power.
