— to pay James Wingate \$75, for publishing revenue and tax laws, passed Dec. session 1842.

— to pay Edward Stabler \$152, for furnishing seal for western shore land office under direction of Chancellor.

— to pay John B. Spencer \$25,50, for publication of laws of 4842.
