## CHAPTER 96.

An act to allow the several collectors of taxes in Baltimore County, herein mentioned further time to complete their collections.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Time allowed. Maryland, That William Frush, Joseph Walker, Elijah Taylor, Sellman Cox, Peter W. Gibbons, Charles Jessop and George W. Harryman, late collectors of taxes in Baltimore county, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to collect all taxes or balances of taxes due them as collectors of tax, in the several districts for which they were appointed as collectors of tax in said county, in the same manner and with the same power and privileges which they might have done, within the time limited by law, provided, that before any one of said collectors shall coerce Proviso. the payment of any tax as aforesaid, he shall make oath before some justice of the peace for said county, that such tax or the arrears thereof remain due and that he hath not
