Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, conjunction, That John Koontz and Charles Sentz, be, and they are hereby appointed trustees in conjunction with those named in said original act, in the stead of John Roons and Charles Saity, they having been named by mistake in said act, and that the said trustees hereby appointed shall have all the powers and rights in conjunction with the remaining trustees in said act named, as if they had been named and appointed in said original act.

CHAPTER 112.

An act for the benefit of Elijah Friend, of Allegany County.

Passed Jan. 26, 1844.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Elijah Friend, of Allegany county, has represented to this general assembly, that on the sixteenth day of July eighteen hundred and forty-three, he, together with a certain Isaac Friend, entered into a recognizance to the State of Maryland in the penalty of one hundred dollars, before Edmund Hill, one of the justices of the peace of said county, for his own appearance in Allegany county court as a witness for the State, but by a mistake of the magistrate in drawing up said reeognizance, he was also by the terms of said recognizance, made liable for the appearance of said Isaac Friend, at said court, contrary to his own intention, as well as that of the said magistrate: AND WHEREAS the said Elijah Friend, did himself duly appear, and thereby comply with said bond as far as it was meant he should be bound; AND WHEREAS the said Isaac Friend did not appear, in consequence of which, according to the strict terms of said bond, it is thought that the said Elijah Friend would be answerable for the penalty of said bond, which in the opinion of this legislature would be unjust and unreasonable - Therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Elijah Friend, be, and he is hereby discharg- from liability. ed from all liability to the State, under said bond, in consequence of the non-appearance of the said Isaac Friend as aforesaid.
