

ties as they shall think expedient for the government and discipline of the said Academy, and the execution of the regulations thereof, and also to make such regulation for the direction, visitation and examination of the said Academy, and the students and scholars therein as shall best promote the important objects of the institution; *Provided always*, That the said ordinance be not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this State.

CHAP. 120.

Proviso.

To meet four times a year.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the said trustees and their successors, or a majority of them, shall meet at least four times in every year in stated quarterly meetings, to be appointed by their own ordinances, and at such other times as by the said ordinances or their own adjournments they may direct, and when so assembled, they shall have power from time to time to appoint a president, treasurer and secretary, to make contracts with the professors or teachers relative to the instruction of the scholars to be placed under their care, and for the payment of their salaries, to examine the progress of the students and scholars, to hear and determine on all complaints and appeals, and all matters touching the discipline and government of the said Academy and the execution of their ordinances, and generally to manage the state and concerns of the said Academy, in such manner as they shall deem best for the advantage of the institution.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That nothing herein contained shall be construed as to authorize this corporation to issue any device, token, note, certificate or other evidence of debt to be used as a currency.

Issue forbid.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the right is hereby expressly reserved to the General Assembly of Maryland, at its pleasure, to alter, or repeal the act of incorporation.

Right reserved.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That this act of incorporation shall apply to the present stone school-house erected at Pikesville, near to the Rev. Joseph Matthew's church.

CHAPTER 120.

An act for the relief of the Devises of Robert Medford.

Passed Feb. 15, 1844.
