CHAPTER 135.

Passed Mar. 6, 1839. *An act to incorporate the Baltimore Academy of the Visitation.*

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Eliza Matthews, Mary H. Jenkins, Clotilda Millard, Louisa Walsh, Mary Olivia Stone-street, Joanna Fitzgerald, Ann Hurley, Rose A. Neale, Eliza Smith, Elizabeth Greenwell, and those who may hereafter become members of the association now formed by the parties above named, and their successors, shall be, and they are hereby constituted a body corporate, by the name and style of the Baltimore Academy of the Visitation, with perpetual succession, and by that name may sue and be sued, may have and use a common seal, may take, hold, possess, use and enjoy any estate, real or personal, by gift, devise or otherwise, in fee simple, or for any less estate, and the same, or any part thereof, may lease, sell and convey, by deed or otherwise, with full power and authority to collect and receive all rents and dues which may hereafter become due and owing to the said corporation by suit or otherwise, as any natural person may lawfully do; *provided always*, that the annual income of the estate of the said corporation shall not at any time exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars.

Rules and by-laws

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said association may, under their corporate name aforesaid, pass and make all such rules and regulations for their own government and for the future admission of other members of the association, as it may deem necessary and proper and not inconsistent with the laws of this State or with the laws of the United States.
