CHAPTER 142.

Passed Mar. 7, 1839. *An act for the benefit of Joseph Walker, Collector of Tax for the fourth Collection District, in Baltimore County.*

Authority to collect

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall and may be lawful for Joseph Walker, collector of tax, for the fourth collection district of said county, to proceed in the collection of arrearages of tax, in as full and ample a manner as he could or might have had at any former period, for two years from the passage of this act.

Accounts on oath

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the aforesaid Joseph Walker, shall in every instance, before he may proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace, of said county, that the same remains unpaid, and hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or or part thereof, more than what credits may be allowed thereon.

CHAPTER 143.

Passed Mar. 5, 1839. *An act to incorporate the Western Mechanics' Savings Institution of Baltimore.*

Persons incorporated

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That Joseph Newman, James Dixon, David Carson, Maulden Perine, Thomas Deane, Jacob Israel, John Feast, Cornelius Hollet, Nicholas Smith, Enoch Burnett, Joshua B. Sumwalt, and all and every other person or persons hereafter becoming members of the Western Mechanics Savings Institution of Baltimore, in the manner hereafter mentioned, shall be, and are hereby created and made a corporation and body politic, by the name and style of the Western Mechanics Savings Institution of Baltimore, and by that name shall have succession, and be capable by law to hold and dispose of property, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and defend, and be answered and defended in courts of law and equity, or in any other place whatever, and to receive and make all deeds, transfers, contracts, covenants, conveyances
