CHAPTER 164.

Passed Mar. 12, 1839. *An act to authorize Edward H. Pendleton to remove into this State three Slaves.*

Permission granted

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Edward H. Pendleton be, and he is hereby authorized to remove into this State three negroes, slaves for life; provided, that the said Edward H. Pendleton, shall, within sixty days after such removal, file with the clerk of Baltimore county, a statement in writing, sworn to by the said Edward H. Pendleton, containing the age, sex, names and distinguishing marks of said slaves, and shall also, within the time aforesaid, pay to the said clerk forty-five dollars for the use of the Maryland State Colonization Society, and that said slaves are slaves for life.*

CHAPTER 165.

Passed Mar. 12, 1839. *An act to divorce Catharine Yustena Barron, of Baltimore City, from her husband Joseph F. Barron.*

Divorce

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Catharine Yustena Barron, of the city of Baltimore, be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband Joseph F. Barron, a vinculo matrimonii, and that the said Catharine shall have the custody and guardianship of the child which she has by her said husband.*
