CHAPTER 169.

An act to authorize Philemon Warfield, Collector of Taxes in the Second Collection District of Anne Arundel County, further time to complete his collections. Passed Mar. 13, 1839.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Philemon Warfield, Collector of the second collection district of Anne Arundel County, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to collect any taxes, or balance of taxes now remaining due to and uncollected by him, in the district aforesaid, in the same manner, and with the same power and privileges as are allowed by the existing laws in said cases made and provided.

Authority to collect

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the aforesaid Philemon Warfield, shall, in every instance, before he may proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace, of said county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than what credits may be allowed thereon.

Accounts to be proved

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall not continue in force longer than one year from the date of the passage thereof.
