cHAP. 171 they are hereby authorized at their next annual meetings, if in their judgment, the interests of said county
will be promoted thereby, to levy on the assessable
property of said county, a sum not exceeding three
hundred dollars, to be applied to the purchasing and
cultivation of the milberry tree, and the raising of

silk, as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted. That in case said levy is made, the sum so levied shall be placed under the direction of the trustees of the poor of Kent county, who shall apply it to the purchase and cultivation of the mulberry tree, and raising of silk at the Alms House, in such manner as in their judgment may be deemed most suitable and advantageous to the interests of said county.

## CHAPTER 171.

Passed Mar. 13, An act for the relief of James R. Bounds, and Sarah 1839. Ann his wife, of the city of Baltimore.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the deed of trust herefolore executed, acknowledged and delivered by a certain William Callender, of the city of Baltimore, to Samuel Long of that city, bearing date the first day of August in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, for the uses and trusts therein particularly set forth and mentioned, duly recorded according to law among the land records of Baltimore county court, in liber T. K. No. 272, folio 358, will appear, be, and the same is hereby declared to be null and void, and, none effect.

Now deed to be see Sec. 2. And be it further enacted. That the said William Callender is hereby duly empowered and directed by this act, to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver unto the said Samuel Long, the trustee aforesaid, and to his executors, administrators, and assigns a new deed of trust, conveying and assigning the same property, together with the appurtenances, which is contained, described and conveyed in the deed of trust above mentioned, in trust in the first place for the sole and separate eas and benefit of the said Sarah Ann
