

ling house attached to the said Beaver Dam School House, in such manner and upon such terms as a majority of the stockholders interested in said lot and dwelling house may direct, and it shall be the duty of the said John Kinzer and Surratt D. Warfield to divide the proceeds of the sale of the said lot and dwelling house among the stockholders in proportion to the number of shares owned by each respectively.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That all and every act or acts which may be repugnant to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 178.

*An act to extend the time of William Frush, Collector of Taxes, in Baltimore County, to complete his collection.*

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That William Frush, one of the collectors of taxes, in Baltimore county, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to collect any balance or arrears of taxes that may be due to said Frush, with the same power and privileges as are now allowed by law; provided, the said Frush shall make oath before some person qualified to administer the same, that such balance or arrearage has not been paid, and the same yet remains due, and that no security or satisfaction has been received for the same, beyond the amount for which said Frush may have given credit on his accounts.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall continue and be in force, until the first day of November, in the year eighteen hundred and forty.
