CHAP. 243. no person but a subscriber shall be a trustee; and provided, that no subscriber shall be entitled to more than five votes, for a subscription of fifty dollars, nor more than ten votes for an amount of subscription of one hundred dollars, or more.

Books to be kept

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the trustees for said Academy, shall keep or cause to be kept a book, for the use and as the property of said corporation, in which shall be duly entered and recorded all subscriptions to, and for the use of said corporate objects, and all other proceedings of said corporation.

Rules and regula-

Sec. 5. And he it enacted. That the said trustees and their successors, or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority to make fundamental ordinances for the government of the Academy aforesaid, and the education of youth, and to appoint such person or persons, as they, or a majority of them may think, proper. to be a teacher, or teachers of the said Academy,

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That the said trustees and their successors, or a majority of them, shall meet at least twice in each year, at such time as shall be anpointed by their own ordinances, in order to examine the progress of the students and scholars, and to hear and determine on all complaints and appeals, and all matters touching the discipline of the school, and the good and wholesome execution of their ordinances, on all which occasions a majority at least of the trustees shall compose a quorum.

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That the said trustees and their successors, by the name and style aforesaid, shall have perpetual succession, and be capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, defend and be defended in any court of justice whatever, and to make and use a common seal, and the same to alter or renew at pleasure, and severally to do and perform all things relative to the management of the Academy.
