An act for the benefit of John Kelly.

Preamble

WHEREAS, it appears by the petition of John Kelly, of Prince George's county, that he has not the necessary residence to enable him to obtain the benefit of the insolvent laws of this State, according to the existing law; and whereas, the said John Kelly, has offered to comply with all the other provisions of said laws:—Therefore,

Insolvent laws extended to

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Kelly, of Prince George's county, be, and he is hereby authorised to apply for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this State, by petition in writing, addressed to the judges of Prince George's county court, and the said court is hereby authorised to extend to him the benefit of said laws, in the same manner as if he had the residence required by said laws; *provided,* the said John Kelly, shall in all other respects comply with the provisions of said laws.

CHAPTER 278.

A supplement to an act to establish Magistrates' Courts, in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, so far as the same relates to Montgomery county.

Court in Medley's district

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of May next, the justices of the Magistrates' Court, in and for Medley's, or the third district of Montgomery county, or a majority of them, shall hold their monthly court, for the said district, at least once in every month, at Poolesville, and Barnesville, alternately.
