CHAPTER 308.

Passed April 2, 1839, *A supplement to the act passed December session 1834, chapter 298, relating to the Public Roads, in St. Mary's County.*

Preamble WHEREAS, it has been shown by experience that the Levy Court of St. Mary's county, have not been able to let out by contract, the roads of said county, in the manner provided for in the first section of the act to which this is a supplement:—Therefore.

Authority to appoint supervisors *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners of St. Mary's county, are hereby authorised and empowed, in their discretion, to appoint fit and proper persons to be supervisors of the public road in said county, within such divisions and districts as shall be specified and assigned by the said commissioners, and the said supervisor are hereby authorised to employ hands on such terms, regulations and restrictions, as said commissioners may prescribe and direct, to keep said roads, or divisions in repair.

Their powers

Levy authorised *Sec. 2. And be it enacted,* That the commissioners aforesaid are hereby authorised and required to levy upon the assessable property of said county, such sum, or sums of money as may be necessary for the purposes of the act.
