

James C. Reyner, James Duke, and such other persons as may be now, or hereafter associated with them, shall be, and they are hereby incorporated and made a body politic and corporate, under the name and style of the Union Silk Company of Caroline county, for the purpose of promoting the growth and culture of the mulberry tree and manufacture of silk, and prosecution of all such other operations, as may grow out of, or be connected with said business, as may be established in Caroline county, under the name and style of the Union Silk Company of Caroline county, and that said company is hereby invested with all the rights and privileges and powers conferred upon such companies by an act prescribing general regulations for the incorporating of manufacturing and mining companies, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, and that said company is subject to the restrictions and regulations prescribed in said act.

CHAP 319.

Name and style

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the capital stock of said company shall not be less than three thousand dollars, nor more than thirty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of five dollars each, to be raised by subscription, and that the said company shall have the right to purchase and hold land, not exceeding five hundred acres in the said county.
