

CHAP. 325. vacancies being however hereby required, before they shall be competent to act, to enter into bond, with sureties and condition, and in penalty as prescribed by the second section of this act in regard to the commissioners herein named.

Limit 2 years

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That this act and all the privileges, franchises and rights conferred hereby, shall expire and cease to be exercised at the expiration of two years from and after the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 324.

Passed April 2, 1839. *A supplement to an act for the building of a public Bridge over the South-East branch of the Wicomico River, at Salisbury, in Somerset County, passed December session, eighteen hundred thirty-seven, chapter ninety-four.*

Proceedings confirmed

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the proceedings of the commissioners appointed by the act, to which this is a supplement, be, and the same are hereby confirmed, so far as relates to the location of any street, or streets, from the said bridge to any other street in Salisbury, and to the assessment of damages; *provided, however,* that the cost of building said bridge, and the amount of said damages, shall not exceed, when added together, the sum of eight hundred dollars.

CHAPTER 325.

Passed April 2, 1839. *An act to allow James Worthington, of John, to change the location of a Public Road.*

Permission granted

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That James Worthington, of John, be, and he is hereby authorized to change the location of the public road through his farm, in Anne Arundel county, so as to make said road run parallel with the Annapolis and Elkridge Rail Road; *provided,* that it be done at the expense of the said Worthington, and that the
