road, and kept in repair as other county roads are, and
the said Worthington, or his agent, shall have the right
to shut up the old road.

CHAPTER 326.

An act for the relief of Samuel Yacle and Jacob Yacle, Passed April 2
1839.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Levy \$10 annually
for
That the commissioners of Washington county be, and
they are hereby empowered and directed, from and af-
ter the passage of this act, to pay over to Samuel Yacle,
and Jacob Yacle, children of George Yacle, or to their
order, the thirty dollars directed to be assessed and
levied on the assessable property of said county for
their use, by the acts, passed at December session,
eighteen hundred and twenty-four, chapter one hun-
dred and eighty-eight, entitled, an act for the relief of
sundry poor persons in the several counties therein
mentioned.

CHAPTER 327.

An act for the establishment of Primary Schools in Mont- Passed April 2,
1839.
gomery County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly* Annually appoint
1 manager of pri-
mary schools for
each district
of Maryland, That the commissioners for Montgomery
county shall, on or before the third Monday of April
next, and annually thereafter, appoint one intelligent
and reputable citizen in each election district of said
county, as a manager of primary schools in said coun-
ty, and the five persons so appointed, shall be styled Name and style
and known as the managers of primary schools, in
Montgomery county, and in case any of the persons
