CHAPTER 332.

A further supplement to the act to Incorporate the Eastern Bank of Baltimore. Passed April 1,
1839.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Time extend d
That the time within which ten thousand shares of stock were required to be subscribed to the capital stock of the Eastern Bank of Baltimore, in pursuance of the provisions of its charter, is hereby extended until the first day of April, eighteen hundred and forty-two, and if said amount be subscribed on or before that day, then and in that case, said charter shall be deemed and taken to be in full force and operation.

CHAPTER 333.

An act to incorporate the Elkton Lyceum. Passed April 3,
1839.

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly by memorial in writing, that the Reverend William Duke, and a number of the inhabitants of Elkton in Cecil county, have formed themselves into a society called by them, the Elkton Lyceum, for the purpose of general improvement in literature, science, the mechanic arts, and all the branches of useful education, with a library, and cabinet of minerals, and other natural curiosities to be connected with and form a part of the institution, *and whereas*, it is in the opinion of this General Assembly, the true policy of the State, to encourage and assist enterprises of the kind:—Therefore, Preamble
