

CHAP. 335. of Maryland, and that any act, deed or conveyance of the said corporation, to a different intent or to different uses, shall be null and void, and that the Legislature may then take possession of, and control and direct the said property and estate, for the purpose of promoting general science.

Annual report to the legislature required

Sec. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the regents of the University of Maryland, shall, under their corporate seal, and the signatures of their provost and several professors, make an annual report on the first day of January, or within ten days thereafter, of the condition and prospects of said institution, stating among other things, the number of students therein instructed and an enumeration of the different departments of science therein taught, with a full and detailed statement of the accounts thereof showing the proper receipts and expenditures of said regents.

Passed April 3, 1839. *An act to incorporate the Farmer's Silk Company of Queen Anne's County.*
