SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of continuation Maryland, That hereafter all free white male citizens, for above the age of twenty-one years, having the same residence and qualifications that are prescribed by the general election laws of this State, to vote for members of the General Assembly, shall be entitled to vote in all matters relating to the selection of scites for school, houses, and in the election of trustees in the respective school districts where they reside.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That all and every thing repealing classes contained in the law to which this is a supplement, that is contrary to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this bill shall not confined to Frederick county be construed to extend to any county in this State except the county of Frederick.
