make any het or wager on the result of any election or on an 393, elections to take place in this State; and any person or friendly for view persons of finding against this act shall be liable to indictment in the county courts of this State, if the offence be committed in any county, and in Baltimore city court if the offence be committed in Baltimore city, and on conviction thereof, shall be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars, to be collected as other fines.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That all fines collected Figure 5 the Fund under this act shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Western Shore for the benefit of the school fund of the State.

Sec. S. And be it enacted. That every deposit of popular tenses money hereafter in any part of the State as a wager or bet upon elections in this State or elsewhere, shall be forfeited and paid over to the levy courts or county to remark school commissioners of the county, for the use of primary school in Said county.

CHAPTER S93.

An act to encourage the formation of Volunteer Compa- Passed April 5, nies.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this State to encours pressible age the formation of Uniform Volunteer Companies, as affording the most prempt and efficient means to suppress insurrection and preserve order and tranquility within our borders:—Therefore.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Service, two was Manyland. That every citizen of the State, above the former M. day age of eighteen years, who shall, after the passage of this law, serve seven years successively, in a uniform volunteer corpany, shall after that time, be exempted from militial duth, except during war or insurrection.

Sec. 2. Ind be it enacted, That the Governor, by all lemonstrained and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall mappoint and commission one third Lieutenaut, and one Eusign, in addition to the officers already provided for by law, in every company of uniform volunteers

that may be formed in this State.
