Resolution in favor of Alice Markland, widow of Edward Markland, a revolutionary officer. Passed Jan. 30,
1839.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Alice Markland, widow of Edward Markland, or to her order, during her life, an annual pension, payable quarterly, from and after the first day of April last, equal to that which her late husband received from this State, under a resolution passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-three, the half pay of a Lieutenant in the Naval service, during the revolutionary war.
