Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Secretary of State, be, and he is hereby empowered and requested to cause the Indexes to the Laws of Maryland, from eighteen hundred and thirty-two, to eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, recently printed, to be bound and distributed as follows:
