Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasures of the Western Shure, pay to Colonel John Budd, of the ferty-second regiment of Maryland Milita, the said sum of twenty-four hundred, eightyeight dollars and twenty-six cents, for his and their use, and that the said Colonel John Budd pay over to the several persons entitled, the amount due to each.

Resolution in favor of Bennet Bracco.

assed Mar. 28, 1839.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Bennett Bracco, of Taibot county, heir at law of Captain Bennett Bracco, an officer of the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, in lieu of the two hundred arres of land, due the sail Bennett Bracco for his revolutionary services.

Resolution in favor of Captain William A. Spencer. Passed Mar, 29, 1839.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Adjutant General of this State be, and he is hereby directed to farmish to the order of Captain William A. Spencer, of the Centerville Guards, sixty stands of maskes, with the necessary accountements, by his order being accompanied with the company's bond of security for their safe keeping and returns.
