*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Colonel John Budd, of the forty-second regiment of Maryland Militia, the said sum of twenty-four hundred, eighty-eight dollars and twenty-six cents, for his and their use, and that the said Colonel John Budd pay over to the several persons entitled, the amount due to each.

Resolution in favor of Bennet Bracco.

Passed Mar. 28,  
1839.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Bennett Bracco, of Talbot county, heir at law of Captain Bennett Bracco, an officer of the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, in lieu of the two hundred acres of land, due the said Bennett Bracco for his revolutionary services.

Resolution in favor of Captain William A. Spencer. Passed Mar. 29,  
1839.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland.* That the Adjutant General of this State be, and he is hereby directed to furnish to the order of Captain William A. Spencer, of the Centreville Guards, sixty stands of muskets, with the necessary accoutrements, by his order being accompanied with the company's bond of security for their safe keeping and return.
