That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to O'Neill and Mitchell, and to William O'Neill, or to their orders, the sum of one thousand and fifty-eight folders and thirty cents, for nails farnished to the State Tobacco Warehouse number four, as certified by Richard Middleton, late Inspectro of said warehouse.

Passed Mar. 6, Resolution authorising the Treasurer of the Western 1803. Shore, to pay to John Howard, of Mason county, Kentucky, a soldier of the revolution, in the Maryland line, the half pay of a private.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to John Howard, of Mason county, in the State of Kentucky, a soldier of the revolution, in the Maryland line, or to his order, the half pay of a private of the revolution, during his life, in quarterly payments.
