Sanderson, of Baltimore, for the use of the Independent Blues, one hundred knapsacks of glazed leather, upon bond being given by him, to be approved by the Adjutant General.

Resolution in favour of Elizabeth Lorantz.

Passed April 1,
1839.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Elizabeth Lorantz, of the city of Baltimore, the widow of Ferdinand Lorantz, who was a soldier in the war of the revolution, or to her order, the half pay of a private of the revolutionary war, during her life, in quarterly payments, commencing the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.
