> Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Mary Painter, of Washington county, widow of Melchier Painter, a Revolutionary soldier, or to her order, the half pay of a private of the Revolution during her life, in quarterly payments, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Passed April I, Resolution in favor of Wm. S. Green.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all proceedings on two judgements obtained by the State of Maryland, against William S. Green, in Anne Arundel county court, be suspended until the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty; provided, the said defendant pays the said judgments in the following manner, that is to say; one half of the said debt and all the interests due thereon, on or before the first day of August next, and the other half of the said debt and all the interest and costs then due, on or before the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand right hundred and ferty; provided, that the said William S. Green and his securities shall file their assent hereto, on or before the first day of January.
