- COURTS OF THIS STATE**,—The authority heretofore given to the, to sentence persons convicted of crimes to serve a portion of their time in solitary cells, on low and coarse diet, recinded and annulled, 400 3
- CRAMER, JACOB**,—Authorising, to convey a part of a certain lot, or portion of ground, situate at Utica, in Frederick county, to the trustees of a primary school, &c. 254
- CRAMER, AMOS**,—See *Roads—Frederick County*, and chap. 268.
- CREEK, PETER**, of Washington county,—For the relief of the heirs of the late, authorising them to hold real estate, &c. 417
- CRIMES AND PUNISHMENTS**,—Supplement to the act of 1835, ch. 200, relating to, 69
- In case of free negro or mulattoe convict being ordered to be sold out of the State, under the original act, there shall be allowed by the sheriff, &c. making said sale, out of the proceeds; to the officer apprehending, prosecuting &c., one-fourth of the proceeds of the sale—the balance he shall pay to the State treasury, " 1
- The treasurer shall apply the amount so paid to the payment of the interest on the loan contracted for the Maryland Penitentiary, if any be due, if not, then to reduction of the principal, " 2
- If said principal cannot at the time be reduced, he shall invest the money as a sinking fund for that object. " 2
