

CHAPTER 75.

CHAP. 76.

A supplement to an act, entitled an act, relative to the Jail of Baltimore City and County, passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty one, chapter fifty eight. Passed Feb. 23, 1839.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That there shall be annually hereafter appointed seven Visitors of Baltimore city and county Jail, four of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in the manner other city officers are now appointed, and three by the commissioners of Baltimore county, at such time as to them shall seem expedient. Seven visitors
4 appointed by the city
3 by the County Commissioners

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted.* That the said visitors so appointed shall have and exercise all the powers, and shall perform all the duties in relation to the jail of Baltimore city and county, which are authorised and required by the act of December session eighteen hundred and thirty one, chapter fifty eight, entitled an act, relating to the jail of Baltimore city and county. Their powers and duties

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That so much of the act of December session eighteen hundred and thirty one, chapter fifty eight, which is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed. Repealing clause.

CHAPTER 76.

An act for the relief of John Stone.

Passed Feb. 23, 1839.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Tax of Carroll county, be and they are hereby authorized and directed, at their next annual meeting, and so long as they shall thereafter see cause, to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county, for the use of John Stone, a superannuated man, the sum of twenty dollars, payable to John A. Byers, or his order. Levy \$20 annually
