

**CHAP. 10.** commissioners appointed by virtue of this act, shall receive a compensation, not exceeding two dollars per day for every day they shall be necessarily employed in the discharge of the duties imposed upon them by the provisions of this act.

Sec. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the additional election district to be formed by this act, and distinguished by the name of the Pikesville district, or district number three, shall constitute a portion of the first commissioners district in said county, and the other new election district to be known as the White House district, or district number five, shall constitute a portion of the second commissioners district in said county, and the commissioners of Baltimore county shall designate places for holding elections in the election districts created by this act.

### CHAPTER 10.

Passed Jan. 14, 1839. *An act to authorise the Clerk of Frederick county court, to approve the bond of James Carlin.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly of Maryland, that James Carlin was appointed one of the constables for Frederick county, by the Levy court of said county, at their session in May last; and whereas, the bond of said Carlin as constable aforesaid, cannot be approved during the recess of said court; and whereas, the said court will not be in session again till May next:—Therefore,

Bond to be received, &c.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Clerk of Frederick county court, be and he is hereby authorised, empowered and directed to take the bond of James Carlin, as one of the constables of said county, with such securities as the said clerk shall approve, in the same manner, with the same penalty and with the same conditions, as are now prescribed for constables bonds to be taken, by the Justices of the Levy court.
