CHAPTER 101.

A further and additional supplement to an act, entitled an act to provide for the relief and support of the Poor and Indigent Persons of Worcester County, passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-five. Passed Mar. 16,
1840

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the county commissioners of Worcester, be and they are hereby authorized and required to levy and assess on the property in said county, according to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, such further sum or sums of money as the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them, may deem necessary to carry out and complete the purpose of the said original act, not exceeding in the whole, the sum of forty dollars. CHAPTER 102.

An act to allow Mileage to Judges of Elections and Justices of the Orphans' Court in Somerset County. Passed Mar. 17,
1840.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the same mileage that is allowed by law to grand and petit jurors and to witnesses in Somerset county, be and is hereby allowed to all returning judges of elections in the county for going to the county town for the purpose of making returns of elections and returning therefrom; and to justices of the orphans' court for the county for going to the county town for the purpose of holding court, and returning therefrom; and that such mileage be levied and collected as other county charges for the county are levied and collected.
