Empowered to Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, makecollection. That from and after the passage of this act, that Thomas F. W. Vinson, late collector and sheriff, and Thomas English, trustee of William O'Neal, Junior, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, or any subsequent trustee that may be appointed, be and they are hereby empowered to collect all fees, taxes and levies, in the same namer in which they were severally authorised to do whilst they were in office; provided, that if any person or persons, his, her or their representatives, against whom any such fees, taxes or levies may have been rendered, will make eath or affirmation hefore, a suite of the neare.

persons, his, her or their representatives, against whom any such fees, taxes or levies may have been rendered, will make oath or affirmation before a justice of the peace, that the same has been satisfied or paid, that this act shall not extend to such cases; and provided also, that the powers conferred by this set, shall not continue in force longer than the first day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-one.
