CHAPTER 150.

Passed Jan. 30, An act to incorporate the Cumberland Lodge, Number Sixty-one, of Free and Accepted Masons, in Allegany 1840. County.

Incorporated

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Master, Wardens and Members of Cumberland Lodge, Number Sixty-one, of Free and Accepted Masons, and their successors, be and they are hereby declared a body corporate, so far as to render them

Legal capacity capable in law, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, defend and be defended in all and every court of law and equity, and before all or any judges, officers or persons whatsoever; and that it may be lawful for them to have and keep a common seal for their use; and in general to have and exercise all such rights, franchises, privileges and immunities, as by law are incident or necessary to corporations of this kind.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That they and their successors shall, and may at all times hereafter, be capable in law to have, receive and retain to them and their successors, property real, personal and mixed, also devises or bequests of any person or persons, bodies corporate or politic capable of making the same, and the same at their pleasure to transfer or dispose of in such manner as they may think proper; provided always, that the said corporation or body politic shall not at any time hold or possess property, real, personal or mixed, exceeding in value the

sum of twenty thousand dollars.
