CHAPTER 168.

Passed Feb. 25, 1840, *An act to allow William H. Fitzhugh, late Sheriff and Collector of Washington County, further time to complete his collections.*

Time extended *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William H. Fitzhugh, late sheriff and collector of Washington county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect until the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, all balances due him as sheriff and collector of Washington county, in the same manner which he could or might have done within the time limited by law, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.*

Passed Feb. 26, 1840, *An act to divorce Jacob Allison, from his wife Anna Allison.*

Divorce *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Jacob Allison, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife Anna Allison, a vinculo matrimonii.*
