CHAPTER 175.

An act to divorce Eliza Ann Redding, of the City of Bal-Passed Feb. 26, timore, from her husband James Piper Redding. 1840.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Divorce Maryland, That Eliza Ann Redding, of the city of Baltimore, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband James Piper Redding, a vinculo matrimonii.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all the estate, both real Rights secured and personal, of which the said Eliza Ann Redding is now seized or possessed, or to which she is now or may hereafter be entitled by gift, descent, bequest, inheritance or devise, or to which her husband, the said James Piper Redding, is or might be entitled by virtue of such marriage,
