SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said company and their successors by the aforesaid name, shall forever hereafter be able and capable in law, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, defend and be defended, in all or any court of justice whatsoever; and also to have, make and use a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure, and to assemble and meet at such times and places as they may agree upon; and to ordain, establish and put in execution, such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as to them shall seem to be conducive to the interest of the said company, and necessary to the good government and orderly management thereof, the same not being contrary to the laws of this State, or of the United States; and generally to do and execute all such acts, matters and things as to them shall or may appertain to do. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to authorize or empower said corporation to issue any notes, token or certificate or credence of debt, to be used as a currency; and that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to deny the right to the legislature to reclaim at pleasure, the rights and privileges hereby granted. CHAPTER 175.

An act to divorce Eliza Ann Redding, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband James Piper Redding. Passed Feb. 26,
1840.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Eliza Ann Redding, of the city of Baltimore, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband James Piper Redding, a vinculo matrimonii. Divorce

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That all the estate, both real and personal, of which the said Eliza Ann Redding is now seized or possessed, or to which she is now or may hereafter be entitled by gift, descent, bequest, inheritance or devise, or to which her husband, the said James Piper Redding, is or might be entitled by virtue of such marriage, Rights secured
