## CHAPTER 199.

Passed Jan. 30, 1840. *An act to divorce Nancy Cook, of Carroll County, from her husband Rezin Cook.*

Divorce

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Nancy Cook, of Carroll county, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband Rezin Cook, a mensa et thoro; and that the said Nancy shall be and she is hereby declared to be in law capable to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, and in all respects to take, receive and dispose of all property, real, personal or mixed, in the same manner as if she were a feme sole.

May sue, &c. as if she were a feme sole

Guardianship

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Nancy shall have the legal custody and control of her daughter Susan Ann Cook.

## CHAPTER 200.

Passed Jan. 31, 1840. *An act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to open an Alley, from the north side of Cross Street, in the City of Baltimore, between Light Street and William Street.*

Authority to open alley

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, immediately after the passage of this act, be and they are hereby authorised to provide, by ordinance, for opening an alley twenty feet wide, between Light street and William street, from the north side of Cross street, in said city, upon such terms as they may deem just and equitable.

Expenses—and how defrayed

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all the expenses of advertising, and those also which may be incurred for the services of the surveyor and other officers of said corporation, in the execution of any ordinance or ordinances which may be passed by the Mayor and City Council aforesaid, by virtue of this act, shall be defrayed by the parties applying for the passage of the said ordinance or ordinances.
