CHAPTER 288.

An act for the relief of Duff Green.

Passed Mar. 18, 1840.

WHEREAS, Duff Green has brought into this State a ne-Preamble growman named Harriet, a slave for life, with the intention of sending said slave out of the State; and said slave has now been within this State for more than thirty days; and whereas, said Green has become an inhabitant of this State, and desires to retain said slave herein—therefore,
