CHAPTER 330.

An act relating to the Trustees and Governors of Cokesbury College. Passed Mar. 19,
1840.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Trustee authorised to convey lot of ground
That the remaining trustee of the Cokesbury college, incorporated by an act passed at November session, seven-
teen hundred and ninety-four, chapter twenty-six, be and he is hereby authorised to convey a lot of ground situated in the Town of Abington, in Harford county, to the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal meeting house, in said town, by whatsoever corporate name or style they may be known, and the said conveyance shall pass a fee simple title to such trustees, as the same may be made to.

CHAPTER 331.

An act to make valid a certain Deed. Passed Mar. 19,
1840.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Deed made valid
That the deed from Valentine Wentz, Frederick Wentz, David Wentz, Jacob Powell and Elizabeth his wife, John Fleegle and Rachel his wife, to John Hahn, conveying a part of a tract of land, called Ohio, lying and being in Carroll county, and executed in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, be and the same is hereby declared to be valid and effectual in law, to pass the estate in said deed mentioned, as if the same had been duly acknowledged and recorded.
