No. 25.

Resolution in favor of Benton H. Crockett.

Passed Mar. 11,
1840.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer for the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Benton H. Crockett, or his order, out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury, the sum of three hundred and forty-three dollars and eighty-four cents.

No. 26.

Resolution in favor of William Acker, of Carroll County. Passed Mar. 13,
1840

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the armourer at Annapolis, be and he is hereby directed and required to deliver to Captain William Acker of Carroll county, or his order, fifty rifles and accoutrements, upon bond being given by him, to be approved by the Adjutant General.

No. 27.

Resolution in relation to the Maryland Penitentiary. Passed Mar. 14,
1840.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the rules and regulations for the government of the Maryland Penitentiary, submitted by the board of directors thereof, in their last annual report, dated nineteenth December, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, pursuant to an act of Assembly of December session eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, chapter three hundred and twenty, be and the same are hereby confirmed.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby
