No. 50.

Resolution relative to getting a Carpet for the House of Delegates. Passed Mar. 20,
1840

WHEREAS, the carpet of the House of Delegates is entirely worn out and in rags, and it is a mark of proper respect to the people of the State, that the said house should present a plain but comfortable appearance—Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the chief clerk of the House of Delegates, be and he is hereby authorised and directed to cause to be procured a carpet for the floor of the House of Delegates, and to employ a competent person to lay down and fit the same to the said floor, and that the old carpet be sold and disposed of, and the proceeds paid over to the treasurer of the Western Shore.

Resolution in favor of Martha Walls, of Prince George's County. Passed Mar. 20,
1840

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby directed to pay to Martha Walls, of Prince George's county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, annually, in quarterly payments, during her life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of private, commencing from the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty.

Resolution in favor of James A. Wilson.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Harford county, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to take into their consideration the claim of James A. Wilson, of Harford county, for taking care of James Hambleton, in a severe illness, and that the said commissioners shall have power to levy upon the assessable property of said county, such
