Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian, be and he is hereby authorised to furnish two complete sets of the laws of this State, from the State Library, so far as they can be spared from the same, and to purchase the deficiency, if any; and the Treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay the cost thereof, on the Librarian certifying the cost of said books, which may be purchased under this resolution; one copy to be left at the office of the clerk of Howard district court, of Anne Arundel county, for the use of the court thereof; the other copy to be left at the office of the register of wills, for the use of the orphans' court of said district.
